Advanced Injection Therapy

A naturopathic doctor who is licensed by the Manitoba Naturopathic Association (MNA) may be certified to practice Advanced Injection Therapies provided they have successfully completed the requirements outlined in this Standard.

There are two certifications required depending on the type of advanced therapies you plan to practice. (See page 3 for course listings) The MNA requires proof of course completion before implementing advanced injection modalities into your practice.

PART A: Advanced Injection Therapies Part A Training Certification – Peripheral Structures

This course allows registrants to perform prolotherapy and related injections into the area of peripheral joints e.g. toes, ankles, knees, hips, fingers wrist, elbow, shoulder, using prolotherapy, neural prolotherapy, PRP (Platelet Rich Plasma) solutions, visco supplement solutions (hyaluronic acid) or any other solutions or therapies approved by the MNA.

***PART B: Advanced Injection Therapies Part B Training Certification – Axial Structures**

This course allows registrants to perform prolotherapy and related advanced injections on the axial skeleton e.g.: cervical, thoracic, lumbar, lumbar-sacral, sacro-iliac, intercostal, and rib using prolotherapy, neural prolotherapy, PRP (Platelet Rich Plasma) solutions and other therapies or solutions approved by the MNA.

***In order to perform procedures outlined in PART B, members must have successfully completed the Advanced Injection Therapies Part A Training Certification.**

Advanced Injection Therapies Certification Requirements:

In order to apply for certification in Advanced Injection Therapies Part A and or Part B, the registrant must have the following requirements:

- Active member in good standing with the Manitoba Naturopathic Association
- Possess a valid CPR-C (previously CPR – HCP) with AED certification (renewable every 2 years)
- Submit certification in both Intravenous AND Naturopathic Injection Therapies
- Submit certification in Emergency Medicine for IV Certification (renewable every 3 years)
- Submit certification *Advanced Injection Therapies Part A Training Certification- Peripheral Structures AND/OR Advanced Injection Therapies Part B Training Certification – Axial Structures*
- Possess \$3-million liability insurance coverage for all practice locations
- Maintain currency in [Continuing Education Requirements](#)

Additional Requirements

- **Prolozone:** The administration of Prolozone requires certification in both Ozone & Oxidative Therapies and Advanced Injection Therapies (Part A or Part B, as appropriate).
- **Delegation:** A Naturopathic Doctor certified in Advanced Injection Therapies is not permitted to delegate those acts to any other person, or give an order to any other person to perform the injections on his or her behalf. It is professional misconduct to delegate these injection procedures, or direction to another person to perform them.
- **Devices:** used for these procedures must have an active medical device licence from Health Canada (search [Health Canada's Medical Devices Active Licence Listing](#) by "Device name").
- **Aesthetic Procedures:** Other procedures that involve injections, including aesthetic procedures such as PRP injections to the face and other skin areas for aesthetic purposes require certification in those specified aspects of practice

PRACTICE PROHIBITED:

- Registrants must **NOT** perform intra-vaginal injections and intra-cavernous injections.
- Stromal Vascular Fraction injections, bone marrow injections and related injections are **NOT** within the scope of practice.
- Stellate ganglion blocks may **NOT** be performed by any registrants

Course Requirements

Courses are subject to change. Please contact the MNA if a course is no longer offered and/or if you have questions about eligibility of new training programs not listed below.

Advanced Injection Therapy – Part A Training Certification Requirements:

Approved Part A courses require a minimum of **three (3) days** of training including both theoretical and practical hands-on components.

- *Prolotherapy Module 1 and 2* (total of 3 days training) – offered by the American Osteopathic Association of Prolotherapy Regenerative Medicine
- *Annual Conference* – offered by the American Osteopathic Association of Prolotherapy Regenerative Medicine. Registrants may only apply for certification if they have completed **both** the Beginner's Prolotherapy Course and the Annual Conference which includes practical training.
- *Module 1 Prolotherapy Intensive Course* – offered by Dr. Kevin Davison ND at Maui Regenerative Medicine
- *Advanced Injection Therapy Peripheral Skeleton* (previously *Advanced Injection Therapies – Part A*) course – offered by West Coast Injection Training Inc.
- *Advanced Injections Course: Module 1* – offered by Viatrexx
- *Advanced Injections Module I* – offered by the Naturopathic Academy of Regenerative Injection Therapy

Advanced Injection Therapy – Part B Training Certification

Approved Part B courses require a minimum of an additional **three (3) days** of training focused exclusively on the axial skeleton with both theoretical and practical hands-on components.

- *Advanced Injection Course Module 2* – offered by Viatrexx
