Supervision of Non-Registered Naturopathic College Graduates

Introduction

Board publications contain practice considerations and standards that, in the absence of extenuating circumstances, will be adopted by all Members in the care of their patients and in the practice of the profession. Board standards and guidelines are developed in consultation with professional practice leaders and describe current professional expectations. It is important to note that these publications may be used by the Board or other bodies in determining whether appropriate standards of practice and professional responsibilities have been maintained.

Purpose

The Manitoba Naturopathic Association (MNA) has established this standard of practice to assist Members who choose to supervise non-registered naturopathic college graduates ("Graduates") to fulfill their regulatory obligations. Working with graduates is distinct from working with student externs and imposes different obligations and responsibilities for the Members.

Intent

To assist Members in understanding their obligations and responsibilities, in the interest of public protection, when supervising Graduates.

Complaints

If the MNA receives a complaint about the practice of a Graduate who is, or has been, practicing the profession before being registered, the information will be reviewed and will be taken into consideration when the Graduate applies for registration.

A complaint that arises from actions of the Graduate \underline{will} be the responsibility of the Member.

This document is not intended to provide legal advice and if faced with a specific situation, Members are urged to obtain professional advice.

An approach to a professional issue that is generally accepted as appropriate by informed and competent Members.

Definition of Performance Expectation

The manner in which a Member typically achieves the corresponding standard of practice.

Standard of Practice

1.0 Pre-requisites

Members in good standing who have been registered in the Active category for a minimum of two years may supervise the naturopathic practice of Graduates under specific conditions.

Performance Expectation

1.0 Pre-requisites

Before undertaking the supervisory role, the Member ensures:

- the Graduate has graduated from a CNME accredited naturopathic school and could meet all of the requirements for registration except for successful completion of the NPLEX and Manitoba Board Exams;
- Valid CPR Level C with AED;
- the Member informs the Board in writing of the Graduate's start date (see Appendix II) a minimum of ten business days prior to commencement;
- the Member accepts full responsibility for the actions of the Graduate under their supervision;
- the Member ensures that there is adequate errors and omissions insurance in place to cover the Graduate for the duration of the supervisory relationship;
- the Member ensures that the Graduate has a current clean police check;
- all patient care is the responsibility of the Member.
- Expiration of Term: the terms outlined in this document shall not exceed 12months. If a longer term is required, the Member may contact the MNA Board who may consider a extension request.
- The Graduate will not be eligible to purchase the practice of the Member until a full-practicing member of the MNA.

Standard of Practice

2.0 Practice Requirements

The supervisory role is intended to cover the period while the Graduate is in the process of successfully completing all required regulatory exams.

The Member ensures that the supervisory role is conducted in accordance with the MNA's criteria.

The Member is on location **at all times** while patients are being seen by the Graduate

Performance Expectation

2.0 Practice Requirements

The Member ensures that the following criteria are met:

a) the Graduate does not use the ND designation until registered with the MNA;b) the Graduate is actively working towards registration;

c) patients are informed of the Graduate's registration status and that a Graduate will be working with them under the supervision of the Member;

d) a written notice is displayed prominently in the office – see sample on Appendix I attached;

e) consent is obtained from the patient indicating that the Graduate, under the supervision of the Member, is involved in providing their health care;

f) all charts and treatment recommendations for patients seen by the Graduate are reviewed, signed and dated by both the Graduate and the Member at the end of each visit;

g) patient receipts will clearly indicate the Member's name and Registration number; h) the Member is on location at all times .

Standard of Practice 2.1 Practice Limitations Only the Member performs controlled acts and acupuncture.	 Performance Expectations 2.1 Practice Limitations The Member is not permitted to delegate to a Gra any controlled act. Graduates are not permitted to perform any of the controlled acts as they are not registered to practice and are no longer under the auspices of academic institution. Only the Member: Communicates a diagnosis Inserts a hand, finger, or instrument beyond the labia majora or beyond the anal verge; Performs a procedure on tissue below the dermis e.g. for the purpose of venipuncture, skin-pricking, Moves the joints of the spine beyond the individual's usual physiological range of motion using a fast, low amplitude thrust; Administers a substance by injection or inhalation; Performs needle acupuncture.

Appendix 1 Sample of notice to be posted in the Member's office

NOTICE TO ALL PATIENTS
